MONTGOMERY COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, is saddened to confirm the death of a woman related to COVID-19. She was in her 70s from Willis, and she died in the hospital. We offer our condolences to her family at this time.

We can also confirm the number of ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 has decreased to 465 today. That number includes 29 hospitalizations. 424 people have fully recovered. The number of total positive cases has increased 25 since Friday to 913.

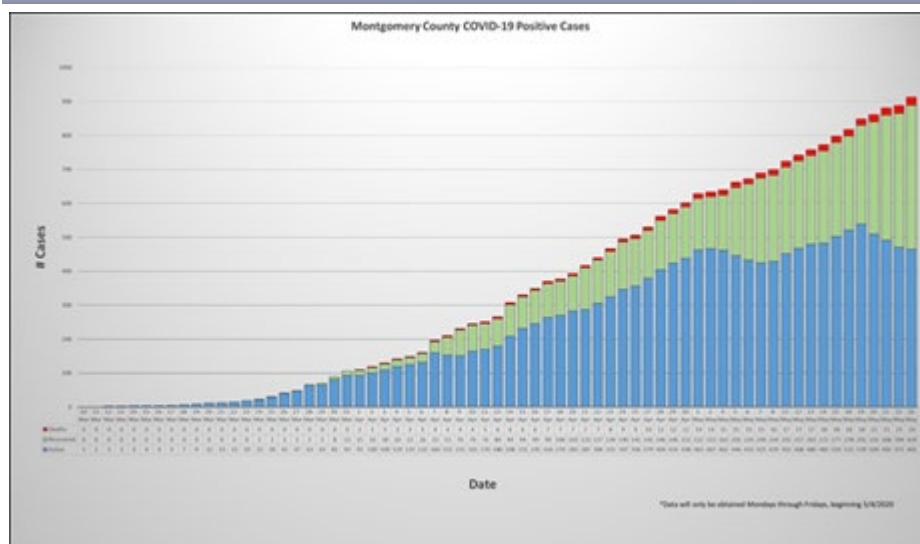
