MONTGOMERY COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, can sadly confirm two additional deaths related to COVID-19.

- A woman in her 70s, from Spring, died in the hospital. She had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19.
- A woman in her 50s, from New Caney, died in the hospital. She had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19.

We offer our condolences to both families at this time.

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 106 to 6,397 since yesterday's report.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 decreased by 82 to 2,234 since yesterday's report.
- 56 residents are known to be in the hospital, as a result of contact investigations. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 3,920 people have clinically recovered.


