### **MONTGOMERY COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE**

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, can confirm an additional death related to COVID-19.

A woman in her 90s, from Conroe, died in hospice care. She had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19. We offer our condolences to her family at this time.

### We can also confirm:

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 95 to 12,591 since yesterday's (10/13) report. All cases were tested in the month of October.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 increased by 40 to 1,796 since yesterday's (10/13) report.
- 30 residents are known, as a result of contact investigations, to be in the hospital. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 8,237 people have clinically recovered.


