#### MONTGOMERY COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, can confirm two additional deaths related to COVID-19.

- A man in his 50s, from Willis, died in the hospital. There were no co-morbidities noted in his medical records.
- A man in his 80s, from Pinehurst, died in the hospital. He had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19.

We can also confirm:

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 330 to 15,758 since yesterday's (11/18) report. All 330 new cases were tested in the month of November.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 increased by 277 to 2,306 since yesterday's (11/18) report.
- 29 residents are known, as a result of contact investigations, to be in the hospital. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 10,099 people have clinically recovered.

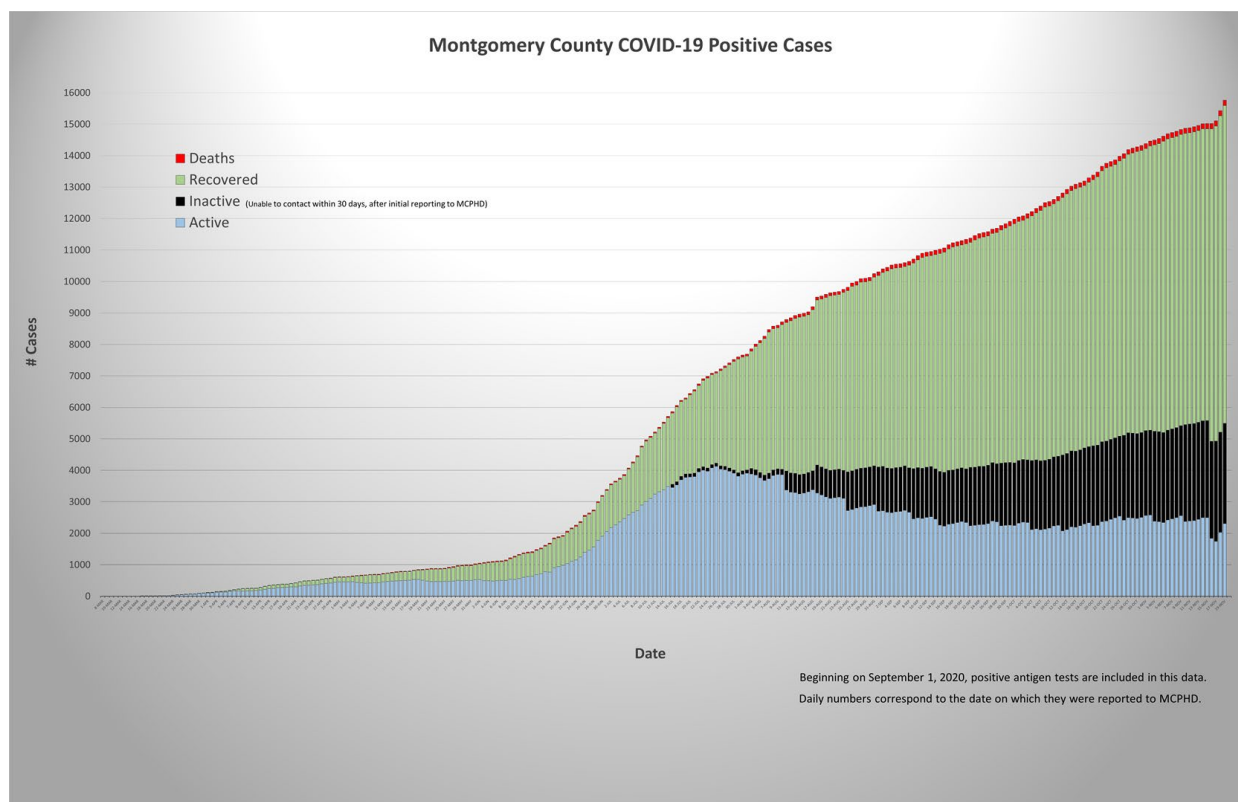
Follow CDC guidelines to slow the spread of COVID-19 in our community.
